

APPROXIMATELY, ESTIMATE, ESTIMATION, ESTIMATIONS

Under the Mosaic Law, when a man sanctified his house as holy to the Lord, a priest was to **estimate** its value. Whatever value the priest assigned, that was its value. If he then wanted to redeem his house (get it back), that's how much money he had to pay (plus 20% on top of that).

- **Leviticus 27:14-15:** "And when a man shall sanctify his house to be holy unto the LORD, then the priest shall estimate it, whether it be good or bad: as the priest shall estimate it, so shall it stand. And if he that sanctified it will redeem his house, then he shall add the fifth part of the money of thy estimation unto it, and it shall be his."

Under the Mosaic Law, if a person sanctified a field to the Lord that he purchased from someone else (which meant he was renting that land until the year of Jubilee), a priest was to **estimate** the value of that land based on how many years there were until the year of Jubilee. The person was then required to pay that value to the Lord as a holy thing. (In this case the person was actually giving money to the Lord and not the land. He couldn't give the land itself because he was just renting it.)

- **Leviticus 27:22-23:** "And if a man sanctify unto the Lord a field which he hath bought, which is not of the fields of his possession; Then the priest shall reckon unto him the worth of thy estimation, even unto the year of the jubile: and he shall give thine estimation in that day, as a holy thing unto the LORD."

The bedstead of King Og the giant was 9 cubits long and 4 cubits wide. (This is **approximately** 13.5 feet by 6 feet.)

- **Deuteronomy 3:11:** "For only Og king of Bashan remained of the remnant of giants; behold his bedstead was a bedstead of iron; is it not in Rabbath of the children of Ammon? nine cubits was the length thereof, and four cubits the breadth of it, after the cubit of a man."

When Joshua sent **approximately** 3,000 Israelites against Ai, they lost and fled.

- **Joshua 7:4:** "So there went up thither of the people about three thousand men: and they fled before the men of Ai."
