

APTLY, FIT, FITLY, FITS, FITTED, FITTETH, FITTING

The Philistines had created armor for Goliath that **fit** him, even though he was a giant.

- **1 Samuel 17:4-5:** "And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span. And he had an helmet of brass upon his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail; and the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of brass."

It seems David was the same height as Saul, since Saul's armor **fit** him. (This means David was tall, because Saul was taller than everyone else in Israel.)

- **1 Samuel 17:38:** "And Saul armed David with his armour, and he put an helmet of brass upon his head; also he armed him with a coat of mail."

When David left Jerusalem (to flee from his son Absalom), he told Zadok that if God didn't delight in him then God should do to him as He saw **fit**.

- **2 Samuel 15:26:** "But if he thus say, I have no delight in thee; behold, here am I, let him do to me as seemeth good unto him."

The 17,200 soldiers of the sons of Jediahel were **fit** to go out to war.

- **1 Chronicles 7:11:** "All these the sons of Jediahel, by the heads of their fathers, mighty men of valour, were seventeen thousand and two hundred soldiers, fit to go out for war and battle."

The Gadites who joined David when he was in the wilderness were men of war who were **fit** for battle.

- **1 Chronicles 12:8:** "And of the Gadites there separated themselves unto David into the hold to the wilderness men of might, and men of war fit for the battle, that could handle shield and buckler, whose faces were like the faces of lions, and were as swift as the roes upon the mountains;"

It's not **fitting** for princes to lie. Those who are in a position of authority must be honest.

- **Proverbs 17:7:** "Excellent speech becometh not a fool: much less do lying lips a prince."

It's not **fitting** for fools to say wise things. (This is because they're fools, and wisdom isn't part of their nature.)

- **Proverbs 17:7:** "Excellent speech becometh not a fool: much less do lying lips a prince."

God is in control of our life and directs it as He sees **fit**. (This means we don't have free will.)

- **Proverbs 20:24:** "Man's goings are of the LORD; how can a man then understand his own way?"

God guides the heart of rulers as He sees **fit**. (This means rulers don't have free will.)

- **Proverbs 21:1:** "The king's heart is in the hand of the LORD, as the rivers of water: he turneth it whithersoever he will."

Solomon compares a word **fitly** spoken to golden apples in a silver setting. (This means speaking the right word at the right time is a very precious and valuable thing.)

- **Proverbs 25:11:** "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver."

It's not **fitting** to honor a fool.

- **Proverbs 26:1:** "As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool."

In the land of Israel, it's not **fitting** for rain to fall in the harvest time.

- **Proverbs 26:1:** "As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool."

In the land of Israel, it's not **fitting** for snow to fall in summer.

- **Proverbs 26:1:** "As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool."

The woman said the eyes of her beloved (Solomon) were **fitly**

set in his head.

- **Song of Solomon 5:12:** "His eyes are as the eyes of doves by the rivers of waters, washed with milk, and fitly set."

The carpenter **fits** an idol with planes. (In other words, he uses his own hands and his own tools to create the idol, which he then puts in his house and worships as a god. This is utterly foolish.)

- **Isaiah 44:13:** "The carpenter stretcheth out his rule; he marketh it out with a line; he fitteth it with planes, and he marketh it out with the compass, and maketh it after the figure of a man, according to the beauty of a man; that it may remain in the house."

God gave control of the earth, and the things that are in the earth, to others as He saw **fit**. (In other words, God chooses those who are in authority over nations.)

- **Jeremiah 27:5:** "I have made the earth, the man and the beast that are upon the ground, by my great power and by my outstretched arm, and have given it unto whom it seemed meet unto me."

God is in control of the course of history, and will change it when He sees **fit**.

- **Daniel 2:21:** "And he changeth the times and the seasons: he removeth kings, and setteth up kings: he giveth wisdom unto the wise, and knowledge to them that know understanding:"

God has the power to raise up nations and tear them down. He can make them small or large, honored or despised, as He sees **fit**.

- **Obadiah 1:2:** "Behold, I have made thee small among the heathen: thou art greatly despised."

God told the Jews that a lying prophet who prophesied of wine and strong drink would be a **fitting** prophet for them.

- **Micah 2:11:** "If a man walking in the spirit and falsehood do lie, saying, I will prophesy unto thee of wine and of strong drink; he shall even be the prophet of this people."

When Jesus returned to Capernaum and entered into a house, so many people gathered that they couldn't all **fit** around the door.

- **Mark 2:1-2:** "And again he entered into Capernaum after some days; and it was noised that he was in the house. And straightway many were gathered together, insomuch that there was no room to receive them, no, not so much as about the door: and he preached the word unto them."

Those whose heart is on the things of this world, and not on the things of God, aren't **fit** for His kingdom.

- **Luke 9:62:** "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God."

Those who are called to the kingdom of God, but who look

back at the things they left behind, aren't **fit** for the kingdom of God.

- **Luke 9:62:** "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God."

If salt has lost its saltiness then it's not **fit** for use on land or on the dunghill. (In other words, there's no longer any purpose it can serve, and has become trash.)

- **Luke 14:35:** "It is neither fit for the land, nor yet for the dunghill; but men cast it out. He that hath ears to hear, let him hear."

After Paul spent an entire day speaking to the Jews of Rome, Paul told them the Holy Spirit had **aptly** described the Jews as people who wouldn't accept the words of God.

- **Acts 28:25-27:** "And when they agreed not among themselves, they departed, after that Paul had spoken one word, Well spake the Holy Ghost by Esaias the prophet unto our fathers, Saying, Go unto this people, and say, Hearing ye shall hear, and shall not understand; and seeing ye shall see, and not perceive: For the heart of this people is waxed gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes have they closed; lest they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them."

Paul compared the church to a building that has been "**fitly** framed together". (In other words, it's composed of many

different parts that all have their purpose, and which all work together in unison.)

- **Ephesians 2:21:** "In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord:"

One day the whole church will be **fitly** joined together. Every part will be in its place and will function properly.

- **Ephesians 4:16:** "From whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love."

Wives must submit as is **fit** in the Lord. They must not submit in sinful ways that are contrary to God's commandments.

- **Colossians 3:18:** "Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as it is fit in the Lord."

Fathers chasten their children as they see **fit**.

- **Hebrews 12:9-10:** "Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected us, and we gave them reverence: shall we not much rather be in subjection unto the Father of spirits, and live? For they verily for a few days chastened us after their own pleasure; but he for our profit, that we might be partakers of his holiness."

In the book of Revelation, the great whore (the false end-times religion) is said to be a city that reigns over the kings of the earth. (This may be either Rome or Babylon, since they both

fit that description and they both sit on seven hills.)

- **Revelation 17:18:** "And the woman which thou sawest is that great city, which reigneth over the kings of the earth."
