# OVERFLOW, OVERFLOWING, OVERFLOWED, OVERFLOWETH, OVERFLOWN, OVERFLOWS

God caused the water of the Red Sea to **overflow** upon the Egyptian army as it pursued the Israelites (drowning them).

- **Deuteronomy 11:4:** "And what he did unto the army of Egypt, unto their horses, and to their chariots; how he made the water of the Red sea to overflow them as they pursued after you, and how the LORD hath destroyed them unto this day;"

In ancient times, the Jordan river **overflowed** in harvest time.

- **Joshua 3:15:** "And as they that bare the ark were come unto Jordan, and the feet of the priests that bare the ark were dipped in the brim of the water, (for Jordan overfloweth all his banks all the time of harvest,)"

When the priests who were carrying the Ark of the Covenant set foot in the Jordan river, it had **overflowed** its banks.

- **Joshua 3:15:** "And as they that bare the ark were come unto Jordan, and the feet of the priests that bare the ark were dipped in the brim of the water, (for Jordan overfloweth all his banks all the time of harvest,)"

The Israelites crossed the Jordan river at a time when it **overflowed** its banks. This means they crossed the river when it was at its widest and worst.

- **Joshua 3:15-17** "And as they that bare the ark were come unto Jordan, and the feet of the priests that bare the ark were dipped in the brim of the water, (for Jordan overfloweth all his banks all the time of harvest,) That the waters which came down from above stood and rose up upon an heap very far from the city Adam, that is beside Zaretan: and those that came down toward the sea of the plain, even the salt sea, failed, and were cut off: and the people passed over right against Jericho. And the priests that bare the ark of the covenant of the Lord stood firm on dry ground in the midst of Jordan, and all the Israelites passed over on dry ground, until all the people were passed clean over Jordan."
- **Joshua 4:18:** "And it came to pass, when the priests that bare the ark of the covenant of the LORD were come up out of the midst of Jordan, and the soles of the priests' feet were lifted up unto the dry land, that the waters of Jordan returned unto their place, and flowed over all his banks, as they did before."

The eleven Gadites who joined David when he was hiding from Saul in the wilderness crossed over the Jordan river at a time when it had **overflowed** all its banks (which was a noable feat).

- **1 Chronicles 12:8, 15:** "And of the Gadites there separated themselves unto David into the hold to the wilderness men of might, and men of war fit for the battle, that could handle shield and buckler, whose faces were like the faces of lions, and were as swift as the roes upon the mountains; ... These are they that went over Jordan in the first month, when it had overflown all his banks; and they put to flight all them of the valleys, both

toward the east, and toward the west."

Eliphaz (one of Job's three friends) said that the foundation of the wicked was **overflown** with a flood. (This may be a reference to the flood of Noah, which destroyed a very wicked world.)

- **Job 22:15-17:** "Hast thou marked the old way which wicked men have trodden? Which were cut down out of time, whose foundation was overflown with a flood: Which said unto God, Depart from us: and what can the Almighty do for them?"

Job said that God binds the floods to prevent them from **overflowing**. (This is the fulfillment of His promise that He would never again send a flood that destroyed the whole world)

- **Job 28:11:** "He bindeth the floods from overflowing; and the thing that is hid bringeth he forth to light."

God asked Job who is the one that created a place for waters to **overflow**. (The answer is the Lord.)

- **Job 38:25:** "Who hath divided a watercourse for the overflowing of waters, or a way for the lightning of thunder;"

David said he had come into deep waters where the floods **overflowed** him. (In other words, he was in serious trouble.)

- **Psalms 69:2:** "I sink in deep mire, where there is no standing: I am come into deep waters, where the floods

overflow me."

David prayed that God wouldn't allow the flood to **overflow** him. (In other words, David prayed that God would save him from his many enemies.)

- **Psalm 69:15:** "Let not the waterflood overflow me, neither let the deep swallow me up, and let not the pit shut her mouth upon me."

The Israelites said that when God smote the rock, the waters gushed out and the streams **overflowed**. (In other words, they had seen God provide water for them in the wilderness.)

- **Psalm 78:20:** "Behold, he smote the rock, that the waters gushed out, and the streams overflowed; can he give bread also? can he provide flesh for his people?"

God compared the king of Assyria to a river that was **overflowing** its banks. (In other words, he was going to enter the land of Judah with all his glory and fill it.)

- **Isaiah 8:7-8:** "Now therefore, behold, the Lord bringeth up upon them the waters of the river, strong and many, even the king of Assyria, and all his glory: and he shall come up over all his channels, and go over all his banks: And he shall pass through Judah; he shall overflow and go over, he shall reach even to the neck; and the stretching out of his wings shall fill the breadth of thy land, O Immanuel."

The remnant of the Jews that returns to the promised land in

the millennium will **overflow** with righteousness.

- **Isaiah 10:22:** "For though thy people Israel be as the sand of the sea, yet a remnant of them shall return: the consumption decreed shall overflow with righteousness."

The Lord compares His strong one to a flood of mighty waters, which **overflows**. (This seems to be a reference to the Messiah.)

- **Isaiah 28:2:** "Behold, the Lord hath a mighty and strong one, which as a tempest of hail and a destroying storm, as a flood of mighty waters overflowing, shall cast down to the earth with the hand."

In the end times, the rulers of Israel will choose to protect themselves from the **overflowing** scourge by taking refuge in lies (instead of refuge in God) and making a covenant with death and hell. (They'll make a covenant with the antichrist, but it won't save them from him.)

- **Isaiah 28:15:** "Because ye have said, We have made a covenant with death, and with hell are we at agreement; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, it shall not come unto us: for we have made lies our refuge, and under falsehood have we hid ourselves:"

In response to Israel's end times covenant with death and hell (the antichrist), God will **overflow** their hiding place as water floods an area. Israel won't be able to hide in their lies, and their covenant with death won't save them.

- **Isaiah 28:17-18:** "Judgment also will I lay to the line, and righteousness to the plummet: and the hail shall sweep

away the refuge of lies, and the waters shall overflow the hiding place. And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it."

Even though Israel is going to make a covenant of lies (in the end times) with death and Hell to avoid the **overflowing** scourge, when the scourge comes the nation will be trodden down by it.

- **Isaiah 28:18:** "And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it."

The **overflowing** scourge which will appear in the end times will be so severe that those who hear of it will be vexed by it.

- **Isaiah 28:18-19:** "And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it. From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you: for morning by morning shall it pass over, by day and by night: and it shall be a vexation only to understand the report."

The **overflowing** scourge that will appear in the end times will go against Israel both day and night.

- **Isaiah 28:18-19:** "And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through,

then ye shall be trodden down by it. From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you: for morning by morning shall it pass over, by day and by night: and it shall be a vexation only to understand the report."

The **overflowing** scourge that will appear in the end times will go against Israel one morning after another.

- **Isaiah 28:18-19:** "And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it. From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you: for morning by morning shall it pass over, by day and by night: and it shall be a vexation only to understand the report."

When the **overflowing** scourge that will appear in the end times goes forth against Israel, it will conquer them.

- **Isaiah 28:18-19:** "And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it. From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you: for morning by morning shall it pass over, by day and by night: and it shall be a vexation only to understand the report."

One day the breath of the Lord will be an **overflowing** stream. (This is pointing to a time of terrible judgment upon the nations, and seems to be related to the end times.)

- **Isaiah 30:27-28:** "Behold, the name of the Lord cometh from far, burning with his anger, and the burden thereof



is heavy: his lips are full of indignation, and his tongue as a devouring fire: And his breath, as an overflowing stream, shall reach to the midst of the neck, to sift the nations with the sieve of vanity: and there shall be a bridle in the jaws of the people, causing them to err."

When the Jews pass through rivers (which seems to be referring to danger), they won't **overflow** them. This is because God will be with them.

- **Isaiah 43:1-2:** "But now thus saith the Lord that created thee, O Jacob, and he that formed thee, O Israel, Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by thy name; thou art mine. When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee: when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee."

When God spoke against the Philistines, He said there would be an **overflowing** flood. (This seems to refer to a coming invasion.)

- **Jeremiah 47:1-2:** "The word of the Lord that came to Jeremiah the prophet against the Philistines, before that Pharaoh smote Gaza. Thus saith the LORD; Behold, waters rise up out of the north, and shall be an overflowing flood, and shall overflow the land, and all that is therein; the city, and them that dwell therein: then the men shall cry, and all the inhabitants of the land shall howl."

God told the false prophets of Israel that His judgment was coming and would be extremely powerful. The Lord compared

it to an **overflowing** shower.

- **Ezekiel 13:2-3, 10-11:** "Son of man, prophesy against the prophets of Israel that prophesy, and say thou unto them that prophesy out of their own hearts, Hear ye the word of the Lord; Thus saith the Lord God; Woe unto the foolish prophets, that follow their own spirit, and have seen nothing! ... Because, even because they have seduced my people, saying, Peace; and there was no peace; and one built up a wall, and, lo, others daubed it with untempered mortar: Say unto them which daub it with untempered mortar, that it shall fall: there shall be an overflowing shower; and ye, O great hailstones, shall fall; and a stormy wind shall rend it."

In the end times, God will send **overflowing** rain upon the soldiers of Gog (when they try to invade Israel).

- **Ezekiel 38:18, 22:** "And it shall come to pass at the same time when Gog shall come against the land of Israel, saith the Lord God, that my fury shall come up in my face. ... And I will plead against him with pestilence and with blood; and I will rain upon him, and upon his bands, and upon the many people that are with him, an overflowing rain, and great hailstones, fire, and brimstone."

An angel told Daniel that in the future, one of the sons of the king of the south would invade and **overflow** Israel.

- **Daniel 11:10:** "But his sons shall be stirred up, and shall assemble a multitude of great forces: and one shall certainly come, and overflow, and pass through: then shall he return, and be stirred up, even to his fortress."

An angel told Daniel that in the future, a vile person would **overflow** nations and kingdoms. (This seems to be a reference to the antichrist.)

- **Daniel 11:21-22:** "And in his estate shall stand up a vile person, to whom they shall not give the honour of the kingdom: but he shall come in peaceably, and obtain the kingdom by flatteries. And with the arms of a flood shall they be overflowed from before him, and shall be broken; yea, also the prince of the covenant."

An angel told Daniel that in the future, a vile person would **overflow** the armies of the king of the south and the king of the north. (This seems to be a reference to the antichrist.)

- **Daniel 11:21, 40:** "And in his estate shall stand up a vile person, to whom they shall not give the honour of the kingdom: but he shall come in peaceably, and obtain the kingdom by flatteries. ... And at the time of the end shall the king of the south push at him: and the king of the north shall come against him like a whirlwind, with chariots, and with horsemen, and with many ships; and he shall enter into the countries, and shall overflow and pass over."

After the day of the Lord (the tribulation) has ended, God will give the Israelites abundant crops and will **overflow** their vats with wine. (This is a reference to the millennium.)

- **Joel 2:24:** "And the floors shall be full of wheat, and the vats shall overflow with wine and oil."

God compared the valley of Jehoshaphat (where the Gentile nations will gather against Israel in the end times) to a press that was full and to vats that were **overflowing**. He said it was a mighty harvest that He would reap. (In other words, that's where God was going to judge the nations.)

- **Joel 3:11-13:** "Assemble yourselves, and come, all ye heathen, and gather yourselves together round about: thither cause thy mighty ones to come down, O Lord. Let the heathen be wakened, and come up to the valley of Jehoshaphat: for there will I sit to judge all the heathen round about. Put ye in the sickle, for the harvest is ripe: come, get you down; for the press is full, the fats overflow; for their wickedness is great."

# SWELLING

Moses sent the plague of boils upon the land of Egypt by sprinkling ashes up toward heaven. Once he did that, they became a boil that broke forth with **swelling** upon both people and animals.

- **Exodus 9:8-10:** "And the Lord said unto Moses and unto Aaron, Take to you handfuls of ashes of the furnace, and let Moses sprinkle it toward the heaven in the sight of Pharaoh. And it shall become small dust in all the land of Egypt, and shall be a boil breaking forth with blains upon man, and upon beast, throughout all the land of Egypt. And they took ashes of the furnace, and stood before Pharaoh; and Moses sprinkled it up toward heaven; and it became a boil breaking forth with blains upon man, and upon beast."

God compared the coming times of war in Judah to the **swelling** of the Jordan river. (In other words, He told Jeremiah that things were going to get much worse in the future.)

- **Jeremiah 12:5:** "If thou hast run with the footmen, and they have wearied thee, then how canst thou contend with horses? and if in the land of peace, wherein thou trustedst, they wearied thee, then how wilt thou do in the swelling of Jordan?"

When God spoke against Babylon, He said someone was going to go against the habitation of the strong during the **swelling** of the Jordan. However, He was then going to make them suddenly run away. (It's not entirely clear what this means, but this may be an end times prophecy.)

- **Jeremiah 50:43-44:** "The king of Babylon hath heard the report of them, and his hands waxed feeble: anguish took hold of him, and pangs as of a woman in travail. Behold, he shall come up like a lion from the swelling of Jordan unto the habitation of the strong: but I will make them suddenly run away from her: and who is a chosen man, that I may appoint over her? for who is like me? and who will appoint me the time? and who is that shepherd that will stand before me?"
